

CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

- P If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us.
- C But if we confess our sins, God, who is faithful and just, will forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

(Silence for meditation and reflection)

- P Let us then confess our sins to God, our Father
- C Most merciful God, we confess that we are by nature sinful and unclean. We have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We justly deserve your

<u>EASTERN HEIGHTS</u> To Host Gospel Concert Musicians and Community Breakfast!

<u>Eastern Heights</u> is hosting Dave Anderson and Roger Walck for one worship service on <u>Sunday</u>, <u>August 18</u>, 2024 at 10 a.m.

Dave and Roger have a combined 100 years experience in music ministry! The audience will often be invited to sing along with Dave and Roger.

In addition to their music experience they are ambassadors for the Shepherd's Canyon Retreat ministry.

Shepherd's Canyon Retreat provides week-long counseling retreats for men and women in full-time ministry who are in the midst of burnout, stress, depression, and conflicts of all kinds. The Shepherd's Canyon Retreat ministry is based in Arizona.

On August 13, 1993, Dave Anderson, his wife Barbara, and five others survived a plane crash in the Bering Sea. The seven missionaries were in 41-degree water for about an hour. Their rescue has been called the most dramatic air/sea rescue in aviation history. At the services at Eastern Heights Lutheran Church & Open Arms, St. Paul, Dave will share highlights from their crash and rescue story.

The public is invited to this event & it is an ideal time for you to bring visitors with you to church! A free-will offering will be received in support of the Shepherd's Canyon Retreat ministry. Pastor Steve and Stephanie Benson have volunteered for two separate weeks at Shepherd's Canyon (serving as retreat chaplain and kitchen helper!) Pastor Chuck Fenton has served on the Board of Directors for Shepherd's Canyon Retreat. This is a ministry that deserves & needs our prayers and support.


What Can We DO?
