

Parts of Our Church and Worship

Last month, we focused on the *Chancel*. We are now going to talk about the *Narthex* as well as the *Baptismal Font*. From Ruth Street, the main glass doors at the true front of the church lead into the *Narthex*. The origin of the *Narthex* was as a gathering place before entering the church where all were welcome—a place to get into the mindset of worship before stepping foot into the sanctuary. It is also interesting to point out that traditionally, the *Narthex* was at the west end of the church, thus entering the sanctuary going east. Isaiah 24:14-15 talks about how God's people raise their voices in praise from the west and in the east give glory to God. Matthew 24:27 talks about how the Son of Man will come back and be visible like lightning in the east is seen in the west.

In the front, before going up to the chancel, on the left is the *Baptismal Font*. Above the *Baptismal Font* is a statue dedicated by a member of our congregation in memory of a loved one. This statue has Jesus with kids in his arms and around Him, reminding us of Mark 10:13-16 where Jesus told the disciples to "let the little children come to me." The *Baptismal Font* is where we baptize people by gently dipping a shallow metal shell and pouring it onto the person 3 times with the words, "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."


