



Witnesses to Christ: People from His Passion

John tells us why he wrote his Gospel: "Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in His name" (John 20:30–31). Life! When we believe that Jesus is the Christ, God gives us life—abundant life, forgiven life, and eternal life.

Historically, the Fourth Gospel is likened to an eagle—an image that suggests John soars to heights of glory and grandeur. That's because the evangelist paints a stunning portrait of Jesus, who is the bread of life; the resurrection and the life; and the way, the truth, and the life. Life in Jesus. That's God's gift to you!

This Lent, our life in Christ will be strengthened as we hear the witness of those in John's Gospel who journeyed to the cross. Along the way, we'll meet villains, such as Barabbas and Pontius Pilate, as well as sinners, such as Peter (who denied Jesus *three* times), Mary Magdalene (who was possessed by *seven* demons), and Judas Iscariot (who betrayed Jesus for *thirty* pieces of silver).

Please Pray...

The Psalm writer, under God's inspiration, wrote (about 3,000 years ago):

¹ My people, hear my teaching; listen to the words of my mouth. ² I will open my mouth with a parable; I will utter hidden things, things from of old— ³ things we have heard and known, things our ancestors have told us. ⁴ We will not hide them from their descendants; we will tell the next generation the praiseworthy deeds of the Lord, his power, and the wonders he has done. ⁵ He decreed statutes for Jacob and established the law in Israel, which he commanded our ancestors to teach their children, ⁶ so the next generation would know them, even the children yet to be born, and they in turn would tell their children. ⁷ Then they would put their trust in God and would not forget his deeds but would keep his commands. ⁸ They would not be like their ancestors—a stubborn and rebellious generation, whose hearts were not loyal to God, whose spirits were not faithful to him. (Psalm 78:1-8)

Notice how the emphasis is clearly on telling a new generation about the truth. God, our Creator, is real. But our children (and their children) will never know HIM, unless we find a way to communicate...

This task (to tell a new generation about Jesus) is what our Eastern Heights and Open Arms family is all about in 2022. Please join me in praying, working, and supporting these initiatives:

- 1. Best Practices for Ministry Conference. A team of our staff and volunteer leaders are learning about the best ways to reach and communicate with a new generation. Ideas and strategies that are working in other churches around the country will be brought home by our group to be implemented.
- 2. Online, streaming worship. Every Sunday at 8:30 and 11 a.m. people from all over the country (and around the block) are joining us for worship. If you are sick, or just can't get out on any given Sunday, try Online Worship. Please encourage your friends, family members and neighbors to check us out digitally. (For those without internet access, we have a telephone conference call—Turbobridge—available).
- 3. Lent & Easter, Witnesses To Christ. Starting in March and continuing in April, we will hear from some eyewitnesses to the terrible/wonderful events in that pivotal Spring in Jerusalem when

Jesus was killed. In addition to worship, we will have a special Sunday morning class for children and adults *together*, March 6 through April 10, from 9:45 to 10:45 a.m.

4. "In all things"—2022 Lutheran Youth Gathering. Our Director of Christian Education, Bradley Asmus, will be leading a group to Houston, TX, this summer to worship, learn, and be inspired along with 20,000 young people from around the nation.

We need <u>you!</u> Together we can make a difference in telling a new generation about Jesus here in the east metro of the Twin Cities and around the world. There is Good News: "God is real. He sent Jesus to rescue us from our sins. There is hope, now and forever!" Let's tell a new generation of His dearly loved children.


