CALL TO WORSHIP

- P We cherish Christ-centered fullness.
- C The thief comes to steal, kill and destroy.
- P But Jesus says, "I have come so that you may have life."
- C "And have it abundantly."
- P For in Christ all the fullness of the Deity lives in bodily form,
- C And we have been given fullness in Christ.
- P Let us pray: Lord God, Heavenly Father, we frequently tell ourselves that we don't have enough—enough time, enough love, enough wisdom. In this time of worship come, in the power of your Holy Spirit, to impart the fullness we have in Christ. Assure us that in Christ we have enough; indeed, more than enough, now and forevermore.
- C Amen.

CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

- P In today's second lesson Paul writes, "For in Christ all the fullness of the Deity lives in bodily form, and we have been given fullness in Christ." (Colossians 2:9–10)
- C And yet, O Lord, we live as though we have nothing.
- P Complaining about our lack.
- C Believing that we never have enough.
- P The thief has come,
- C To steal, kill and destroy,
- P The gifts given us in the Gospel.
- C And so we feel empty, alone and ashamed, yearning for fullness in Christ.
- P Believe and receive the good news! Paul announces that though you were dead in your sins, God made you alive with Christ in Holy Baptism. He forgave you all your sins, having canceled the written code, with its regulations, he took it away, nailing it to the cross. And having disarmed the powers and authorities, he made a public spectacle of them, triumphing over them by the cross. These promises are yours in Christ Jesus, now and forevermore!
- C We have fullness in Christ!

PRAYER OF THE DAY

- P The Lord be with you.
- C And also with you.
- P Let us pray: Lord Jesus, you have come so that we might have life and have it abundantly. Fill us, we pray, with baptismal gifts so that we know, again, that we have absolute fullness in you; for you live and reign with the Father and Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.
- C Amen.

First Reading

Colossians 2:6-15

⁶ So then, just as you received Christ Jesus as Lord, continue to live your lives in him, ⁷ rooted and built up in him, strengthened in the faith as you were taught, and overflowing with thankfulness. ⁸ See to it that no one takes you captive through hollow and deceptive philosophy, which depends on human tradition and the elemental spiritual forces of this world rather

than on Christ. ⁹ For in Christ all the fullness of the Deity lives in bodily form, ¹⁰ and in Christ you have been brought to fullness. He is the head over every power and authority. ¹¹ In him you were also circumcised with a circumcision not performed by human hands. Your whole self ruled by the flesh was put off when you were circumcised by Christ, ¹² having been buried with him in baptism, in which you were also raised with him through your faith in the working of God, who raised him from the dead. ¹³ When you were dead in your sins and in the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made you alive with Christ. He forgave us all our sins, ¹⁴ having canceled the charge of our legal indebtedness, which stood against us and condemned us; he has taken it away, nailing it to the cross. ¹⁵ And having disarmed the powers and authorities, he made a public spectacle of them, triumphing over them by the cross.

Gospel Reading

Mark 1:14-20

¹⁴ After John was put in prison, Jesus went into Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God. ¹⁵ "The time has come," he said. "The kingdom of God has come near. Repent and believe the good news!" ¹⁶ As Jesus walked beside the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting a net into the lake, for they were fishermen. ¹⁷ "Come, follow me," Jesus said, "and I will send you out to fish for people." ¹⁸ At once they left their nets and followed him. ¹⁹ When he had gone a little farther, he saw James son of Zebedee and his brother John in a boat, preparing their nets. ²⁰ Without delay he called them, and they left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired men and followed him.

Message The Source of Life

Where can we find a source that truly provides what we need? It seems like every well runs dry. Every cupboard & pantry is emptied out. Our health (and our youth) runs out too soon. We don't have enough money, enough time, enough energy, or stamina. We compare our lives, our marriages, and our families, to unattainable, media-driven visions of perfection. Then we hold up our life against our own fictional account of how great someone else has it. Even our old times memories work against us. We compare our lives to a memory that nostalgia has so completely edited that it never really existed. "Remember when ...?" "Those were the days." Put it all together and we never have enough.

Paul's letter to the church in Colossae points us to the *Centerpoint* and the true source of *LIFE*. False teachers had infiltrated the Colossian church and their message was simple. "Even though you have Christ, you still don't have enough."

Paul is ready to confront that lie. He writes, "See to it that no one takes you captive through hollow and deceptive philosophy, which depends on human tradition and the basic principles of this world rather than on Christ." (Colossians 2:8) Paul warns us that there are hollow and deceptive movements, methods and messages that take us captive. How do they do it? They constantly say, "You'll never have enough. Ever." Paul clearly points to the ONE source of life that <u>is always</u> enough. Listen again, "For in Christ all the fullness of the Deity lives in bodily form." (Colossians 2:9)

Everything that makes God, God, is in Jesus Christ. *Everything*. Listen, "... and you have been given fullness in Christ, who is the head over every power and authority." (Colossians 2:10) This fullness is delivered through Holy Baptism. Paul goes on to write: "... having been buried with him in **baptism** and raised with him through your faith in the power of God, who raised him from the dead." (Colossians 2:12) Here's the point: JESUS is the source of real, true life. When you were baptized and came to trust Him, you were connected to a source that is **enough!**

We have been given FORGIVENESS FOR OUR FAILURES! Paul wrote, "God made you alive with Christ. He forgave us **all** our sins." (Colossians 2:13) Christ has it all. Christ forgives it all. Paul says there is forgiveness for all of our failures. There is enough! Jesus is also the source of DELIVERANCE FOR OUR DEBTS "... having canceled the record of debt, with its regulations, that was against us and that stood opposed to us; he took it away, nailing it to the cross." (Colossians 2:14) In Paul's day, when the debt was paid, it was nailed publicly in the city square where everyone could see it. The nail cutting through the record of debt was the seal of the debt's cancellation. That's what God did with our spiritual debts. He canceled them and nailed them to the cross. All of our debts have been paid, in full!

Jesus is the source of life... the center point of our lives because of what He has done. Listen again, "And having disarmed the powers and authorities, he made a public spectacle of them, triumphing over them by the cross." (Colossians 2:15) The picture is of a Roman victory parade where defeated armies were publicly marched to their death. At the end of the parade the enemies were stripped, humiliated, and then executed. It was the end. Paul uses this example & word-picture to refer to what Christ did to spiritual powers and authorities.

Jesus is the source of VICTORY OVER ALL TRAGEDY. And he did it by being part of one of these "Roman parades." Soldiers paraded Jesus from Pilate's courtyard to "the place of the skull." Christians call their route through the old city of Jerusalem the Via Dolorosa, or "The Way of Sorrows." At the end of this parade Jesus was stripped, humiliated, and then executed. It was ugly, violent, and barbaric,

but it was not the end. It was not the end! On Easter morning Jesus changed our world. He showed himself alive! He won victory over the enemy no one can beat: death. Heaven's best took hell's worst and Jesus won the victory. The master of death could not destroy the Lord of Life! So, life's tragedies—children who die, suicides, cancer & other disease, and death itself—are not the end! In Christ they are defeated—they are dead and done! We have ultimate victory for all our tragedies! Jesus is coming back, the dead will be raised up, and we will live forever together... because we are connected (by faith) to the all-sufficient source of life, Jesus. HE is enough.

Paul says, "... you have been given fullness in Christ." (Colossians 2:10) Baptized as his daughter or son, we have enough forgiveness, enough deliverance and enough victory! King David said it this way in Psalm 23, "You anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows." We have enough now and forever because *Jesus* is our source of life. Amen.



NEW LUTHERANS FOR LIFE EVENT


Topics at this FREE event include:
